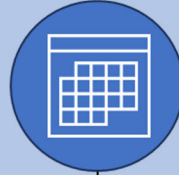


Our Story

2012



Communities In Schools of Portsmouth Virginia Inc and Communities In Schools of Hampton joined to established Communities In Schools of Hampton Roads. The first Executive Director, Quentin Brown was hired to lead the charge.

2013



In April 2013, CISofHR made their first Site Coordinator hire, Hope Sinclair to support Performance Learning Center (PLC) with 150 case managed students.

In November 2013, CISofHR entered their second site, I.C. Norcom in Portsmouth, VA and hired their second Site Coordinator.

2015



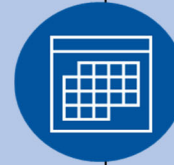
CISofHR supported **5,146** case managed students in **8** schools throughout **4** cities:

- Suffolk: Elephant's Fork Elementary

2016



Thanks to a partnership with 21st Century Grant, CISofHR expanded to Suburban Park Elementary in Norfolk. During the 2016-2017 School Year CISofHR provided services to **6,911** students in **9** schools across **4** cities.



2017

CISofHR provided services to **7,590** students in **11** schools across **5** cities during the 2017-2018 school year.

Organizational realignment to focus on building feeder pattern sites and expanding programs, allowing for early identification and correction of student challenges throughout their K-12 experience.

Expanded to 3 schools in Virginia Beach: Bettie F. Williams Elementary, Bayside 6, and Bayside Middle.

2018



CISofHR expanded services to **12** schools in **5** cities with 11 full time Site Coordinators, supporting **7,544** students.

Expanded to 2 schools in Norfolk: Booker T. Washington High and WH Ruffner Academy.



2019

During the 2019-20 school year, CISofHR expanded services to 4 additional sites to service **11,930** students in **16** schools across **5** cities.

2020

During the 2020-21 school year, CISofHR served 13,621 students in 19 schools across 6 cities.

During the 2020-21 school year, CISofHR expanded services to 5 additional schools.

2021

During the 2021-22 school year, CISofHR served 14,342 students in 21 schools across 6 cities.



2022

During the 2022-23 school year, CISofHR served 14,878 students in 25 schools across 6 cities.



2023

During the 2023-24 school year, CISofHR entered 30 schools across 7 cities throughout Hampton Roads.
